What does it mean to "stand up"?

Where else have we read about a prince standing up? Dan 11:1 What is the job of the "prince"? How will those on the earth be affected when Michael stands up? Is this the Armageddon mentioned in Revelation? Rev 19:17 How do you know?

Who raises the question about timing? To whom was the question directed?

What is the significance of the vision raising both of His hands?

What is being accomplished in the suffering of the saints? Is this the same concept as that in Matt 24:14?

<u>LESSON</u>: That last section of Dan 12:7 took me aback. Is it possible that that is the goal of the suffering of the faithful – "to scatter the power of the holy people"? When you think about it, everything God has been telling man to do is to go out – Adam and Eve from the garden of Eden; Noah's family to fill the whole earth; Christians, take the gospel to the 4 corners of the earth. God has been empowering mankind by His grace and it seems man's penchant is to try and keep all the blessings to himself; but that isn't God's way: "But as truly as I live, all the earth shall be filled with the glory of the LORD." 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Is it important to know about the daily sacrifices being taken away and the abomination that makes desolate being set up? How do you know?

What will we know when we see the daily sacrifices taken away the abomination of desolation set up?

Which marker is this from Dan 9:27? How many other markers are noted in chapter 9?

What's going to happen on the 1, 335th day?

Will Daniel live to see the end times personally?

Is Daniel's name written in the book? Will he be resurrected?

<u>LESSON</u>: Daniel was said to be the wisest man in the world, in his day; yet here, he seems not the understand anything, and if anything, full of more questions and trying to understand. So, what made him wise?

If we look back over the whole book of Daniel, we see that there were things that happened to Daniel that weren't fair in the least.
